Participation in the initiative

- Prerequisite for funding is the existence of a sectoral agreement among social partners
- Funding „common measures“ of the social partners
- Sectoral agreements in which the respective primary goals, focus areas and qualification needs are specified
- The agreement can also be included with the intention of becoming active in the specific framework of the social partner program

Objectives of the Initiative


- **Measures for improving the general conditions**
 - to improve mentoring/ counseling structures
 - to determine in-house qualification needs
 - to reduce best practices and tools to practice
 - further education and training cooperation
 - to improve quality and exchange of experiences
- **Further education and training in companies**
 - vocational training measures can be funded in order to implement existing qualification agreements
 - educationally marginalized and so far underrepresented employees have to be particularly considered.

Results


- 206 projects
- Support of around 150.000 employees and 1.500 companies
- Promotion of 43 collective agreements on training
- 69 new agreements in the period of validity (2009 – 2012)
